## WHAT IS THE LIGHTHOUSE PROGRAM?

The voluntary Lighthouse Program supports at-risk youth and their families through prevention and intervention, aiming to reduce school dropout, crime, and substance use. It provides tailored case supervision, integrating internal and external services and restorative justice practices for sustainable change. The program collaborates with District 51, Colorado Mesa University (CMU), and various community agencies.

## PROGRAM SERVICES

Each youth receives a personalized plan based on their unique needs.

- Mental Health Assessments
- Substance Use Screening and Education
- Counseling (Individual, Group, and Family)
- Academic Support
- Employment or Participation in a Positive Extra-Curricular Activity
- Mentoring
- Classes (Life Skills, Victim Empathy, Anger Management, etc.)
- Curfew



## WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Youth ages four to 18
- Families Seeking Support

## HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

### Referral

- Schools, law enforcement, families, and others can refer youth and families to the program.

### Initial Meeting

- A staff member will meet with the youth and family to create an agreement that outlines goals and responsibilities.

### Program Completion

- Families and youth complete the program by meeting their goals, which can result in positive outcomes like case dismissal or alternative resolution.
