U Visa Certification Process

If you have been the victim of a crime and are applying for a U Nonimmigrant Status Visa, Mesa County Sheriff's Office is a certifying agency that can complete the Supplement B form that must be submitted with your application.

Here is how our process works:

- Complete the MCSO "U Visa Certification Request Form," which is available on our website, https://sheriff.mesacounty.us, and at the front counter of the Mesa County Sheriff's Office, 215 Rice St, Grand Junction, Colorado, 81501.
- 2) Return your completed form to us at the address listed above, by email to uvisa@mesacounty.us, or by mail at the address listed above. Just remember our timeline to complete the form does not begin until we physically receive your form.
- 3) If we are able to certify your application, we will complete the USCIS form I-918, "Supplement B, U Nonimmigrant Status Certification."
- 4) If you need copies of reports or any other materials related to the offense of which you are a victim, those will be provided to you at no cost.
- 5) If we are able to certify your application, we will contact you to either have you come pick up the completed form (you will need to submit a form with an original signature along with your application). If you are unable to pick up the original, we will make arrangements to send the original to you.
- 6) If we are unable to certify your application, we will notify you of this fact, along with information regarding the reason we were unable to certify.
- 7) We will either complete your application or notify you that we are unable to certify your application within 90 days after we have received your completed request. However, if you are already in Federal Immigration Removal Proceedings, or if a parent, child, or sibling who is part of your application will age out within 60 days of our receipt of your request, your application will be completed within 30 days. Please be sure to complete the portions of the request form that alert us if one of these special circumstances apply.
